About us

Paradise Co-operative exists to enrich the lives of local people. Together we: learn through nature and work with the land

Our beautiful community garden site is in SW18, and is just under an acre of nature in the city. Our site has a wildlife pond, orchard and beehives, a yurt for indoor gathering, fire areas as well as our food-growing areas. We are committed to learning through nature and our site hosts weekly outdoor learning sessions for local primary school children, led by our Head of Education. This role would support the Head of Education to deliver these sessions.

About this role

We are looking for someone to work flexibly with us to support the delivery of outdoor curriculumbased sessions with primary school groups on our community garden in Wandsworth.

Hours will be agreed with the Head of Education a month in advance and will usually be 6 hours per day on Wednesdays and Thursdays 9:00 – 15:00. Workshops are 2 hours long, and we usually deliver 2 workshops a day with time for preparation and clearing away.

The role will report to the Head of Education and be part of a supportive small team including our Head of Education, and Community Gardener, and Head of Outreach and Communications.

Pay: £12.80 an hour. This role is contractor (i.e. self-employed) on a zero-hours contract during term-time. Hours for the upcoming month will be agreed a month in advance with the Head of Education based on workshops that have been booked in. Payment is monthly via invoice

Skills and experience:

- Experience working with primary age children in a formal setting (school; childcare; alternative provision; holiday clubs)
- Confident managing behaviour in a flexible and responsive manner, supporting children to take risks in a safe environment.
- A strong communicator who is able to engage with and motivate children from a range of backgrounds across the primary age range.
- A commitment to working as part of a team working closely with the Head of Education to deliver the Paradise Learning curriculum in a creative, effective and engaging way.
- Able to take initiative when setting up workshops, preparing an organised learning environment that enhances learning opportunities for children.
- Organised, proactive, able to problem solve and manage time efficiently
